



Facilities Opened or Closed

The bank opened the branch in Auburn on December 31, 1995. This facility was a State chartered bank until that time and was converted to a branch of Security National Bank.

The bank opened a de novo branch in Topeka on May 5, 1997.

The bank opened the branch in Osage City on December 31, 1997. This facility was State chartered until that time and converted to a branch of Security National Bank.

Also on December 31, 1997, the bank acquired a branch in Beloit, Kansas, as part of the Osage City purchase. This branch was sold to Farmers State Bank of Mankato on June 5, 1998.

The bank opened a de novo branch in the Westloop Dillons in Manhattan on January 6, 2000.

The bank opened the branch in Wamego on July 21, 2000. This facility was Thrift chartered until that time and converted to a branch of Security National Bank.

Also on July 21, 2000, the bank acquired a Thrift in Osage City, Kansas, which was simultaneously relocated to the bank's existing Osage City facility.

On October 9, 2001, the bank merged with Landmark Federal Savings Bank which had 6 branches. These branches were Thrift chartered until the merger. The merger resulted in Landmark National Bank with two branches in Dodge City, a branch in Garden City, Great Bend, Hoisington, and LaCrosse. This brings the number of branches to 12 including 2 branches in Manhattan as well as branches in Auburn, Topeka, Osage City, and Wamego. Kansas. Landmark Federal Savings Bank had a loan production office in Overland Park as well. This office closed effectively 12/31/01.

The bank and its holding company opened an administrative office only at 230 Poyntz in Manhattan in January 2003.

The bank acquired First Kansas Savings & Loan on April 1, 2004. The acquisition included six facilities in Osawatomie, Paola, Fort Scott, Louisburg, Beloit, and Phillipsburg on April 1, 2004. These facilities were Thrift chartered until that time and converted to branches of Landmark National Bank. The bank later sold the Beloit branch on August 13, 2004 and the Phillipsburg branch on September 10, 2004.

On August 19, 2005, the bank acquired two United Missouri Banks in Great Bend. The existing Landmark National Bank facility located at 2120 16th St, Great Bend was closed and the reopened at 1623 Main St, Great Bend (existing UMB facility). The second Great Bend facility is located at 5200 Broadway, Great Bend, Kansas.

On January 1, 2006, the bank acquired four First Savings Bank facilities in Manhattan (2), Junction City and Lawrence Kansas. The Landmark National Bank home office located at 800 Poyntz was closed and relocated to 701 Poyntz Ave, Manhattan. The administrative offices located at 230 Poyntz relocated to 701 Poyntz. Landmark's Dillon's facility closed and relocated to 3005 Anderson Ave, Manhattan, Kansas (former First Savings Bank facility).

On February 18, 2006, Landmark National Bank's Dillon's facility was closed and relocated to 3005 Anderson Ave, Manhattan Kansas (former First Savings Bank facility).

On March 15, 2007, the ATM located inside the McDonald's fast food restaurant, Wamego, Kansas, was closed down and removed.

On August 11, 2007, Landmark National Bank opened its newly constructed bank facility at 6010 SW 6th Ave, Topeka, Kansas 66615. This facility is referred to as the Topeka River Hills facility. This is a full service bank.

On March 10, 2008, the West Loop Dillon's ATM, Manhattan, Kansas, was closed down and removed.

On April 11, 2008, the ALCO store ATM, 3007 Anderson Avenue, Manhattan, Kansas, was closed down and removed.

On May 8, 2009, Landmark National Bank acquired a Cornerbank bank facility located at 4621 W 6th St., Lawrence, Kansas. This is a full service bank.

On May 31, 2009, the American Legion ATM, 114 B McCall Road, Manhattan, Kansas was closed down and removed.

On November 1, 2010, the Landmark National Bank facility located at 816 Main St, Lacrosse was closed and reopened at 808 Main St, Lacrosse.

On May 26, 2011, an ATM was installed at the Landmark National Bank facility located at 808 Main St, Lacrosse.

On July 6, 2011, the ATM located at the K-State union, K-State campus, Manhattan, Kansas, was removed.

On December 13, 2011 an ATM was installed at the Landmark National Bank facility located at Central and Spruce, Dodge City.

On January 17, 2012, Landmark National Bank acquired The Wellsville Bank, located at 112 W 6th Street, Wellsville, Kansas. This is a full service bank.

On November 1, 2013, Landmark National Bank acquired 8 Citizens Bank N.A., facilities located at Fort Scott (2), Iola, Kincaid, Lenexa, Mound City, Overland Park, Pittsburg and 3 Home Loan Offices (Olathe, Overland Park and Shawnee).

On May 16, 2014, the Landmark National Bank facility located at 2205 S. Main, Fort Scott, Kansas, closed. The ATM remained at this location.

On December 3, 2014, the ATM located at 2205 S. Main, Fort Scott, Kansas was closed and taken out of service.

On March 20, 2015, the ATM located at the Manhattan Kansas Regional Airport was closed and taken out of service.

On June 30, 2015 the ATM located at 901 Iowa Street, Lawrence, Kansas was removed and taken out of service.

On December 30, 2016 the ATM located at 1214 Grant Avenue in Junction City was removed and taken out of service.

On July 24, 2017 the bank entered into a lease agreement for a loan production office at 7553 NW Barry Road, Kansas City, MO.

In February 2018, the bank entered into a one-year lease for a loan production office in Zona Rosa, Kansas City, MO. The bank closed that office in February 2019.

In April 2018, the non-deposit ATM located at Allen Community College in Iola was removed and taken out of service.

In December 2018, the non-deposit ATM located at Mercy Health Center in Fort Scott was removed and taken out of service.

In May 2019, LNB opened a loan production office at 3500 W. 75th, Suite 110, Prairie Village, Kansas. On September 9, 2019, this facility was opened as a branch.

On October 1, 2022, Landmark acquired Freedom Bank located at 6640 W. 143rd St, Overland Park, Kansas. This is a full service bank.
